Chatham Education Foundation — \$3,000 to purchase new, high-interest books for the "Books on Break" program, which provides books to students over summer break.

Family Promise of Lee County — \$3,000 to help cover costs of supplies, hygiene products, clothing and transportation costs for transporting residents.

Lee County High School JROTC — \$3,000 to help cover costs of the annual Military Ball.

Outrach Mission, Inc. — \$3,000 to help fund a new program called "Hand Up to Housing Program," which aims to help provide financial assitance for clients to eliminate barriers to self-sufficiency.

Partnership for Children and Families — \$3,000 to help cover costs associated with hosting the annual Lee County Childcare Conference to train early childhood educators.

Pocket Volunteer Fire Dept. — \$3,000 to purchase six new Very High Frequency pagers to help alert members of the department during an emergency situation.
