

Reliable power depends on maintenance

Proactive right-of-way maintenance takes a great deal of planning and hardwork to keep trees from growing close and into our powerlines. Crews work year-round to maintain these ROW areas. Even despite our best efforts, trees from outside of the ROW clearance area that we maintain, fall into lines and cause power outages. You are a big help in making sure trees are not planted in close proximity to lines!

In addition to reducing outages due to vegetation, maintenance also:

- Speeds up outage restoration because crews can more easily access problem areas
- Keeps crews and members safer from downed trees, especially in right-of-way (ROW) areas along roads
- Reduces unexpected costs for repairs related to accessibility issues.
